Salary

It is recommended that apprentices receive a salary of between $\pounds150$ and $\pounds300$ per week. The national minimum apprenticeship wage applies to 16-18 year olds and 19 year olds and over in the first year of an apprenticeship.

Funding

The government will pay 100% of the tuition fees for apprentices aged 16-18 at the start of their apprenticeship. If they are aged 19 or over at the start of the apprenticeship, an employer contribution will apply.

Activate Enterprise operates a reasonable and competitive fees policy to support the remaining contribution towards the cost of the training, subject to eligibility criteria.

Note: Apprentices must work a minimum of 30 hours per week, up to a maximum of 40 hours.

CompTIA and Cisco Exams are not included in the programme and will be chargeable.

THE APPRENTICESHIP APPLICATION PROCESS

Apply for an apprenticeship online through one of our partner colleges, or for one of our current apprenticeship vacancies.



If you've applied through one of the colleges, we we will send you an acknowledgement of your application and invite you for an interview.

If you're under 18, we will send information about the interview to your parents.

Once you have attended your interview, we will review your application and decide if an apprenticeship is right for you.

If you're not ready yet, we will signpost you to suitable college courses.

If you're now ready to get going, we will send you an offer letter.

Your offer will depend on having a suitable job and the right English and maths skills. Depending on the apprenticeship and industry you want to train in, we may also offer you a place on a full-time course at one of our partner colleges. This will help keep your options open.

You will complete a Guroo assessment for English and maths.

This will help establish that you have the right skills to successfully complete your apprenticeship.



Do you have the right skills for the apprenticeship?



You will start your job and enrol on to your apprenticeship.
